



Woodburn Fire District Overview

Thank you for your interest in the Woodburn Fire District (WFD). The following information will provide a district overview and a breakdown of salary ranges and benefits.

Additional Employment Qualifications

In addition to the minimum qualifications listed in the NTN posting, WFD will apply the following additional minimum qualifications to those on the eligibility list when considering an entry level appointment: Apparatus Operator Equipped with Fire Pump and a two year associate's degree in a fire service related field. Candidates that do not have these qualifications will still be placed on the eligibility list but will not be considered for an appointment at WFD until the qualifications are met.

District Overview

WFD is a combination fire district that provides emergency services to the cities of Woodburn and Gervais Oregon and the areas surrounding. The district covers a 75 square mile area which serves an approximate population of 39,500 and maintains four fire stations with 20.5 full-time employees and a 32 member volunteer staff. Career firefighters work either 24 hour shifts out of the main station with a 56 hour schedule or on a peak activity engine which provides extra emergency response during peak response hours. Members assigned peak activity engine work 10 hour shifts four days a week. All career apparatus have four-person minimum staffing which includes one paramedic. The district does not provide ambulance patient transport.

The volunteer staff supplements response from the main station and provides a response from the three out stations. The district is active in the wildland firefighting arena and engages in conflagration deployments with other Marion County fire districts each year. The district has close working relationships with the neighboring fire districts with mutual and auto-aid emergency response agreements and intergovernmental contracts. WFD responded to 3,415 emergency calls in 2020. In addition to emergency response, the career firefighters perform fire and line safety, code enforcement inspections in the community, pre-incident building surveys and provide annual fire safety and prevention education to 2nd grade classrooms in the district.

Salary and Benefits

Compensation packages include an entry level salary range from \$70,465-\$96,340 annually. Medical, dental, vision, life insurance, and disability benefits. Deferred compensation and VEBA programs are also available. An annual allowance of \$1,500 is available for each career member for personal professional development. WFD is a PERS retirement benefit employer. The career firefighter staff is represented by IAFF Local 1660.
